# AHEC Scholars Program Requirements

Must last for a minimum of two years and culminate in the completion of and/or graduation from a degree or certificate program

- Formal application process with defined eligibility criteria
- New cohorts each academic year of the project period (per AHEC center)
- Longitudinal program with interdisciplinary curriculum with discipline-specific points of entry, exit and objectives
- Clinical, didactic, and community-based and team-based training activities
  - Based on 6 Core Topic Areas
  - A minimum of 40 hours per year of didactic education outside of traditional curriculum
  - A minimum of 40 hours per year of clinical education must consist of participation in team-based training
- Placements in rural and/or underserved settings
- One year follow-up is required





# **AHEC Scholars Clarifications**

- Two Year Requirement:
  - Must be a <u>Minimum</u> of two years or longer
- Inclusion of Students Working Towards Degree/Certificate Program Less than Two Years:
  - With prior approval for degree or certificate programs that are less than 2 years, students will be AHEC Scholars for the duration of their academic program
- New Cohorts each Academic Year of the Project Period (per AHEC center)
  - 15-25 students per AHEC Center each academic year (the number of students could vary by AHEC center)
  - Part-time students are allowed; Medical/Nursing residents NOT allowed
  - Discipline-specific points of entry and exit (i.e., entry point can be flexible)
  - Scholars will complete the program upon graduation/completion of academic program
  - 1 year follow up (i.e., where are they working)



# **AHEC Scholars Clarifications**

#### Pre-Health Professions Students

- Pre-health professions students are not eligible to participate in the AHEC Scholars Program
  - Ex: pre-med, sociology, psychology, etc.

#### Allied Health Professions Students

- For allied health programs that are less than 2 years, prior approval is needed via the EHB process.
- It important to identify/recruit disciplines that are considered "high-need" in your catchment areas





# **AHEC Scholars Clarifications**

#### Core Topic Areas

- Current/Emerging Issues
  - Prior Approval needed if NOT discussed in grant application

#### Clinical and Didactic Education

- A minimum of 40 hours per year of didactic education outside of the traditional curriculum
  - An elective course developed for academic credit (which addresses priorities listed in the FOA) can be utilized as hours towards this requirement
- A minimum of 40 hours per year of clinical education must consist of participation in team-based training
  - If the clinical components of the Scholar's academic program meets the requirements (team-based/rural or underserved area), it can count towards this requirement
